Thank you for making the drop-off and pick-up of materials on Tuesday, April 14th a success. Although there are many ways this can be conducted, we will try to maintain some consistency in our process at this time.

- All new take- home packages will be available for pick-up on Tuesday, April 21st. This work will be brought back to school on Thursday, May 7th. At this time, students will pick up new work, which they will bring back on Thursday, May 21st. Unless circumstances dictate change, May 21st would be the day for pick-up of new material again.
- 2. Some work may be found online and some work found in take-home packages. Your child's teacher will direct you through email as to where your work will be found. In most cases, work will be done online and on paper, so you will likely have to come to the school on April 21st. Grade 6-12 students are, when able to do so, encouraged to check their MVSD email accounts. Username: firstname.lastname@mvsd.ca Password: the same one you use to log on to school computers. - 3. The new work material that will be sent home and/or provided online must be completed as part of your child's Term 3 evidence of learning. Grade 9-12 students must complete the assignments provided in order to earn credits. Failure to complete work in a satisfactory fashion will result in either credit recovery in the fall and a delayed graduation if you were on track to graduate this year. Do not hesitate to email your homeroom teacher/course teacher if you have any questions.
- 4. The process for drop-off of completed work and pick-up of new material will be as follows:

Date: April 21st, May 7, and May 21st – Times listed below

Please have **one adult** enter the school through the main entrance.

Find the table for the appropriate grade – drop-off and pick-up tables should be beside each other.

Please make sure that the work you are dropping off is labeled and held together with a paper clip or in an envelope or bag.

- 5. To ensure Social Distancing is taking place, we ask that families only send one adult to pick up and drop off material during the following times on all pick-up days.

We ask that there be only one person at each table at a time; if you have to wait in line, please keep 3 meters between you and others.

If families cannot make the drop-off/pick-up time, please email Mr. Giasson at <u>marc.giasson@mvsd.ca</u>. An alternate time for pick-up and drop-off will be scheduled. If there are families that want to team up and drop-off/pick-up for friends and family, please feel free to organize this on your own. If you have more than one child in school, please pick up all materials at once.

April 24th is a scheduled PD day, so classes were not scheduled for that day. Student packages **will not** include work for that day, but students may catch up on work or work ahead if they wish. Some schools had parent/teacher interviews scheduled for the 24th (Grade 9-12). They are postponed. Ours took place in February, but please feel free at any time to check in with the teachers through email at any time.

Staff members are doing their very best to provide meaningful work and provide lessons, whether online or through paper packages, that are understandable for students and parents. We know that there will be some frustrating moments for all of us. If not all work is completed for a drop-off period, please hand in what has been completed. Every family has their own set of circumstances to deal with and we respect that. We are here to help as best we can, so please make contact if you have any questions.

Again, thank you for your support during this time. We will continue to do our very best to support learning for our students.
